





#### Southwest Sausage Muffins

1/2 pound pork sausage

- 2 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 Tbsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 large eggs
- 1 Tbsp. canola oil or vegetable oil
- 1 1/4 cup milk
- 1 can (4 oz.) green chilies, drained
- 1 cup corn kernels
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar or pepper jack cheese

Preheat oven to 350°. Lightly coat 12 wells of a regular size muffin pan with cooking spray, or use paper liners. Brown the sausage, crumbling it as it cooks. Drain and set aside. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, and salt. Whisk in the eggs, oil, and milk until a batter forms. Fold in the cooked sausage crumbles, drained green chilies, corn, and cheese.

Fill the muffin wells up to the top with the batter. Bake for 18-22 minutes, or until muffins begin to turn golden on top. Let cool before serving. Enjoy!
